Evaluation Methods Used:

Pages have been tested for compliance with the W3C Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 Level AA success criteria, providing an assessment of how accessible the website should be.

Many of the pages are based on templates and are sufficiently similar that only a subset have been tested.

The pages are based on a responsive design layout so they will be tested at different window sizes to trigger the different layouts.

Each page has been tested using these techniques:

- Manual inspection of the source code.
- User interface testing via the GUI of a standard web browser (Windows 10 and Google Chrome). Certain checkpoints will also be tested using other browsers, where their behaviour is known or expected to be different.
- Lightweight tools such as the W3C Online HTML and CSS Validators, AIS Accessibility Toolbar and AIS Colour Contrast Analyser (based on WAI algorithm).
- Assistive technologies such as JAWS screen reader and NVDA screen reader.
